






Supervised Population FY2001 to FY2010




Parole Population FY2001 to FY2010



Total DOC Population FY2001 to FY2010











The percent of offenders incarcerated that are dangerous felons has increased from 9.5% in FY2001 to 19.0% in FY2010. Robbery 1st degree remains the most populous charge among dangerous felonies. Also note that Murder 1st degree is not defined by statute to be a dangerous felony as an 85% minimum served does not apply.





FY2005**








The average aggregate sentence of all incarcerated offenders has increased 4.0% from FY2005 to FY2010. Average sentence length for females have increased 7.5% while the average sentence length for males has increased only 3.6%. In both male and female offenders, the largest increase in average sentence length was among DWI offenders. For offenders incarcerated on June 30, 2010, female offenders were serving an average sentence of 8.9 years and male offenders were serving an average sentence of 12.9 years.







Change in Prison Admissions (FY2001-FY2010)



New admissions to prisons have decreased at 1.1% per year in the last five years compared to 3.7% from 2001 to 2005. What is of significance to the department, because of the impact upon the prison bed capacity, is the decrease in new admissions that are sentenced to a prison sentence. From FY2001 to FY2005 the new term admissions increased 9.4%, but since 2006 the average annual change has decreased at 1.0%.




Male Admissions FY2001 to FY2010















Change in Female Releases FY2001 to FY2010




7. Time Served to First Release

Time served as a percent of the sentence in FY 2010 is the same as in FY 2009 (48.3%). Offenders convicted of offenses committed on or before August 28, 1994 have to serve a minimum prison term if they have committed a dangerous felony (85%) or have prior incarcerations with the Missouri Department of Corrections (40% one prior, 50% two priors and 80% three or more prior incarcerations). Time served includes jail time that is credited to an offender's sentence for incarceration prior to receipt by the Department of Corrections. Offenders convicted of a sex offense in Chapter 566 RSMO have to complete the Missouri Sex Offender Program before being eligible for a parole release.

First release is the first release following the admission for a new commitment. First releases do not include the release of offenders who were returned as parole violators.




**Time Served to First Release

C and D Violent Felonies FY2001 to FY2010**



C and D Violent Felonies FY2001 - FY2010**







8. Recidivism Rates of Institutional Releases

There are many ways to measure recidivism and there are no national standards. The rates calculated by the Missouri Department of Corrections and included in the Offender Profile are for offenders first released in the commitment. These are offenders admitted to prison to serve a new commitment and released to either parole, conditional release or on the discharge of the sentence. Excluded from the calculation is the release of parole violators who have previously been returned to prison for a violation of supervision within the commitment. Recidivism rates that include the release of parole violators are higher than the first release recidivism rates.

The recidivism rates measure two outcomes:

1. The first return to prison following the release (technical violation of supervision or new conviction),
2. The first conviction following the release from prison (the new conviction can be a new prison sentence or probation. Because many offenders returned from parole are returned for a technical violation) the new conviction recidivism rate is not a very helpful indicator of new criminal behavior until two or more years from release.

The data for the calculation of the rates are taken from the DOC offender database. Offenses and incarcerations in other states will not be included unless the offender is returned to the custody of the DOC.

Other recidivism rates are given in the Offender Supervision profile for offenders released to probation following a 120-day or long-term drug program and for offenders serving a new court probation.

Since 2005 there has been a decline in the incarceration recidivism rate both for offenders released from prison (page 58) and for offenders starting probation (page 102). The reduction in recidivism has been attributed to the Department's reentry program, improvements in risk assessment for releasing and managing offenders in the field and changes in supervision practices by the division of probation and parole. The changes in supervision practices were intended to reduce the number of offenders being incarcerated for technical violations when the offenders could continue to be safely supervised in the community.



Rates by Gender



Female Recidivism Rates, First Released FY2001 to FY2010





Male Recidivism Rates, First Released FY2001 to FY2010




**Recidivism Rates by Offense Type, First Released FY2001 to FY2010

9. Sex Offender Population

The sex Offender Population comprises offenders convicted of an offense in Chapter 566 (Sexual Offenses) or of a child abuse offense in Chapter 568 (Offenses against the family) or convicted of failing to comply with the sex offender registration laws in Chapter 589 (Crime Prevention) of the Missouri Revised Statutes.

The sex offender population of 4,870 comprises 16.0% of the total incarcerated population. Of that number 73.2% were from the ages 20 to 44, and 97.4% were male and 71.1% were white.







The first execution in Missouri following the US Supreme Court decision authorizing the legality of capital punishment statutes took place in 1989, although the new capital punishment law became effective in Missouri on May 26, 1977. From June 30, 1991 to June 30, 2010 there have been 64 executions.

The statistics count offenders on the first admission by the Department of Corrections for a conviction of Murder 1st degree for an offense committed after October 1984 or a conviction for capital murder prior to October 1984. Prior to October 1984, Murder 1st degree allowed parole. Re-sentencing and commutation of the death penalty are not included in the charts.

Females**




**Average Parole Sentence Length
Males**





Males**





What is of significance to the department, because of the impact upon supervision caseload, is the increase in paroled offenders of 0.8% per year. Senate Bill 5 enacted in 2003 removed non-violent misdemeanor cases from DOC probation supervision, and this has been the main reason for the decline in new court probations.

Female supervision openings decreased at 0.2% per year in the last five years compared to the 3.1% increase from FY2001 to FY2005. What is of significance to the department, because of the impact upon supervision caseload, is the increases in paroled female offenders have slowed from 11.6% (FY 2001-2005) to 1.4% (FY 2006-2010) annually. Probation following a court stipulated 120-day program has decreased from 3.0% per year (FY 2001-2005) to 1.3% (FY 2006-2010).






Female Closings from Supervision FY2001 to FY2010




Time Under Supervision for FY2010

Offense Group for FY2010**




Time Under Supervision for Parole Offenders Discharged by Offense Group for FY2010




Recidivism of New Probationers, 120 Day and Long Term Drug Program Offenders Released to Probation, FY2001-2010


Recidivism of New Probationers, 120 Day and Long Term Drug Program Offenders Released to Probation, FY2001-2010
