Please find attached a copy of the FY 2011 Offender Profile. The Offender Profile is a collection of important statistics about the offenders supervised by the Missouri Department of Corrections, both incarcerated and on field supervision. The work of the Department is ever challenging and the intention of this statistical abstract is to answer many of the questions that the public, the legislature and Department's own staff often ask about regarding the offenders supervised by the Department. In FY 2011 the Department admitted over 18,000 offenders to prison and 17,000 offenders began a new probation sentence. Every day in FY 2011 the Department supervised over 104,000 offenders.

There is one statistic in which I continue to take particular pride and that is the decline since 2005 in the recidivism rate. The Department attributes the decline particularly to the efforts of the collaborative Missouri Reentry Initiative and to the adoption of evidence-based supervision practices by the Board of Probation and Parole.

I hope you find the Offender Profile useful. Comments about improving the Offender Profile are always appreciated.

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Note: The fiscal year is from July 1 to June 30.








Supervised Population FY2002 to FY2011








Probation Population FY2001 to FY2010







Incarceration Rates by Sentencing County





Offenders convicted of serious offenses serve long prison sentences.

The majority of offenders convicted of a felony are sentenced to probation, so the felony sentencing rate is a more comprehensive indicator of crime.



The percent of offenders incarcerated that are dangerous felons has increased from 10.4% in FY2002 to 19.5% in FY2011. Robbery 1st degree remains the most populous charge among dangerous felonies. Also note that Murder 1st degree is not defined by statute to be a dangerous felony as an 85% minimum served does not apply.

Incarcerated Offenders Serving Life Sentences FY2002 to FY2011









The average aggregate sentence of all incarcerated offenders has increased 26.1% from FY2006 to FY2011. Average sentence length for females has increased 19.1% and the average sentence length for males has increased 26.4%. In both male and female offenders, the largest increase in average sentence length was among DWI offenders. For offenders incarcerated on June 30, 2011, female offenders were serving an average sentence of 8.8 years and male offenders were serving an average sentence of 12.9 years.

The overall number of female offenders decreased 1.8% from FY2006 to FY2011, the number of black female offenders has decreased 21.1%, and the number of white female offenders has increased 3.3%. While still a very small portion of the population, the number of Hispanic offenders increased 25.7%.


5. Admissions to Prison, FY2002 to FY2011

Prior to July 1, 2008 admissions included offenders who were returned to a Community Release Center, but were not subsequently returned to prison. After July 1, 2008 only offenders returning to prison are included as returns from supervision. The effect of the change in reporting was to reduce the number of admissions. In the last fiscal year prior to the change (FY2008) it was estimated that there were about 700 offenders included in admissions who had been admitted and released from a community release center without being transferred to a mainline prison.



New admissions to prisons have decreased at 1.5% per year in the last five years compared to an increase of 3.6% from 2002 to 2006. What is of significance to the department, because of the impact upon the prison bed capacity, is the decrease in new admissions that are sentenced to a prison sentence. From FY2002 to FY2006 the new term admissions increased 6.4%, but since 2006 the average annual change is 0%.

Change in Prison Female Admissions (FY2002-FY2011)



Male Admissions FY2002 to FY2011






















7. Time Served to First Release

Time served as a percent of the sentence in FY 2011 is higher than previous years. Offenders convicted of offenses committed on or after August 28, 1994 have to serve a minimum prison term if they have committed a dangerous felony (85%) or have prior incarcerations with the Missouri Department of Corrections (40% one prior, 50% two priors and 80% three or more prior incarcerations). Time served includes jail time that is credited to an offender's sentence for incarceration prior to receipt by the Department of Corrections. Offenders convicted of a sex offense in Chapter 566 RSMO have to complete the Missouri Sex Offender Program before being eligible for a parole release.

First release is the first release following the admission for a new commitment. First releases do not include the release of offenders who were returned as parole violators.




Time Served to First Release A and B Violent Felonies FY2002 - FY2011



Time Served to First Release to Parole, Conditional Release or Discharge C and D Violent Felonies FY2002 to FY2011




Time Served to First Release C and D Violent Felonies FY2002 - FY2011




Time Served to First Release C and D Sex and Child Abuse Offenses FY2002 - FY2011


Time Served to First Release

Time Served to First Release to Parole, Conditional Release or Discharge C and D Nonviolent and Drug Felonies FY2002 to FY2011




Time Served to First Release C and D Nonviolent and Drug Felonies FY2002 - FY2011



8. Recidivism Rates of Institutional Releases

There are many ways to measure recidivism and there are no national standards. The rates calculated by the Missouri Department of Corrections and included in the Offender Profile are for offenders first released in the commitment. These are offenders admitted to prison to serve a new commitment and released to either parole, conditional release or on the discharge of the sentence. Excluded from the calculation is the release of parole violators who have previously been returned to prison for a violation of supervision within the commitment. Recidivism rates that include the release of parole violators are higher than the first release recidivism rates.

The recidivism rates measure two outcomes:

- 1. The first return to prison following the release (technical violation of supervision or new conviction),
- 2. The first conviction following the release from prison (the new conviction can be a new prison sentence or probation. Because many offenders returned from parole are returned for a technical violation) the new conviction recidivism rate is not a very helpful indicator of new criminal behavior until two or more years from release.

The data for the calculation of the rates are taken from the DOC offender database. Offenses and incarcerations in other states will not be included unless the offender is returned to the custody of the DOC.

Other recidivism rates are given in the Offender Supervision profile for offenders released to probation following a 120-day or long-term drug program and for offenders serving a new court probation.

Since 2005 there has been a general decline in the incarceration recidivism rate for offenders first released from prison (page 65) and for offenders starting probation (page 109). The reduction in recidivism has been attributed to the Department's reentry program, improvements in risk assessment for releasing and managing offenders in the field and changes in supervision practices by the division of probation and parole. The changes in supervision practices were intended to reduce the number of offenders being incarcerated for technical violations when the offenders could continue to be safely supervised in the community.





Female Recidivism Rates, First Released FY2002 to FY2011





Male Recidivism Rates, First Released FY2002 to FY2011




Recidivism Rates by Offense Type, First Released FY2002 to FY2011 First Return to Prison

9. Sex Offender Population

The Sex Offender Population comprises offenders convicted of an offense in Chapter 566 (Sexual Offenses) or of a child abuse offense in Chapter 568 (Offenses against the family) or convicted of failing to comply with the sex offender registration laws in Chapter 589 (Crime Prevention) of the Missouri Revised Statutes.

The sex offender population of 4,966 comprises 16.1% of the total incarcerated population. Of that number 58.2% were from the ages 20 to 44, and 97.5% were male and 70.7% were white.



Sex Offender Recidivism Rates By Completion of MOSOP (First Released FY2002 - FY2011) First New Conviction





Sex Offender Recidivism Rates By Completion of MOSOP (First Released FY2002 - FY2011) First New Sex Conviction



Execution is an authorized punishment for offenders convicted of Murder 1st degree. Offenders not sentenced to death must serve life without parole. The first execution in Missouri following the US Supreme Court decision authorizing the legality of capital punishment statutes took place in 1989, although the new capital punishment law became effective in Missouri on May 26, 1977. From June 30, 1991 to June 30, 2011 there have been 65 executions.

The statistics count offenders on the first admission by the Department of Corrections for a conviction of Murder 1st degree for an offense committed after October 1984 or a conviction for capital murder prior to October 1984. Prior to October 1984, Murder 1st degree allowed parole. Re-sentencing and commutation of the death penalty are not included in the charts.







Males on Parole by Offense Group FY2006 FY2011





Males on Probation by Offense Group FY2006 FY2011







Average Sentences (years) of Parole Offenders Females




Average Parole Sentence Length Males





Average Probation Sentence Length Males









What is of significance to the department, because of the impact upon supervision caseload, is the increase in paroled offenders of 0.8% per year. Senate Bill 5 enacted in 2003 removed non-violent misdemeanor cases from DOC probation supervision, and this has been the main reason for the decline in new court probations.








Time Under Supervision for Parole Offenders Discharged by Offense Group for FY2011






